



Fiber Project Starting Soon

The fiber upgrade project in the villages of Woodville and Baldwin will be starting on Monday, April 27 according to Baldwin LightStream Operations Manager, Oscar Avila. TD&I, the construction company for the project, will begin installing the fiber mainline in the village of Woodville. TD&I is based in Hudson, Wisconsin and has a track record of over 30 years of customer satisfaction, reliability and safety. Engineers from Finley Engineering based in Altoona, Wisconsin will be working with the construction crew.

When the mainline work is completed, TD&I will begin plowing the fiber drops to all homes in the village of Woodville. Residents must either have identified where the pipe will be placed or have their pipe out before the fiber drops can be installed. Earlier this year Baldwin LightStream employees made site visits to identify placement of the pipe. In response to Governor Evers Safer At Home order, Baldwin LightStream suspended all site visits and prep appointments in March. All previously scheduled prep appointments will be completed when it is safe for technicians to be in homes.

When all the drops have been plowed in Woodville, the construction crew will be moving to Baldwin. For the project to be completed on schedule, Avila is requesting the cooperation of all residents.

TD&I and Finley Engineering will be following all social distancing guidelines when working in our communities. When the pipe is out or the placement sticker is on your house, the contractor will not need to meet with residents.
